	Launch boat using dolly
	Make sure motor is up & bungs are in rear of boat
	Make sure the safety equipment & anchor for the boat is on board
	Place emergency lanyard clip and key in ignition.
	Lower the motor to the operating position.
	Ensure the fuel fitting is clean and dry and that it is fully engaged into the tank & mo
	• Prime the motor with the priming bulb• Make sure the breather screw is open on
	petrol tank.
	Start the engine. • Ensure flow of cooling water from rear of engine.
-	Allow engine to warm up. Ensure steady idle.
	Ensure all persons on board are wearing a life jacket and have suitable weather or su
	protection.
	Make sure that you have a Radio & perform a radio check with either the OOD or To
	as appropriate prior to getting underway.
	Remember that whilst these vessels are fitted with safety propeller guards, extreme
	care must be taken when operated near persons in the water. Stop the engine if it is
	likely that any part of a person will come within one metre of the engine.
-	When raising or dropping off anchor or Buoys, make sure that anchors or chain rub of
	rubber side so as to minimise wear & damage.
	End of day shutdown of Rubber Duckie is the reverse of the start. Ensure all loose ite
	are properly stowed & all rubbish removed. Boat & trailer to be hosed down & engir
	flushed. Remember to make sure the breather screw is closed on the petrol tank
